They are also currently working on issues concerning our previous years taxes not being filed properly. We are also currently working with the law firm of O'Donoghue & O'Donoghue to resolve an issue involving the local and the Negotiated Pension Plan (NPP).

2021 BYLAWS REFERENDUM

I want to thank the Bylaws Committee members for their services in carrying out our November 2021 bylaws referendum. I would like to also thank the membership for voting in favor of every proposed bylaw change. The new bylaw changes will become effective on January 1, 2022. The committee will now start on updating our bylaws to incorporate the new changes. Again, thanks to the committee members for their work in conducting the

Mike also served as vice president of the Local until December 2020, when he decided not to run for another term.

As a chairman, Mike was the official you wanted in your corner for any grievances or disciplinary actions that management may have had against any Union member. He would attack with a vengeance to defend that member even when Union officials, who outranked him, would tell him we have done all that could be done for that member. Mike would still fight to the best of his ability. He was not one to give up.

Mike retired from GPO in 2019 and made himself available to Larry Sibiski, chairman of the chairmen's chapel, and to Mike Maher, president of the Local, for any situations that might occur at GPO that would require his expertise and it would be greatly appreciated. He was advising Chairman Sibiski, as well as President Maher, on the recent wage negotiations before his passing.

Mike was always available day or night for the members. He would stay way past his shift to attend a grievance or disciplinary meeting with little or no complaint and very little sleep. He always answered his telephone and would answer any and all of his voicemails in a timely manner.

Columbia Typographical Union 101-12 lost a great champion and friend in Mike Cullen's passing and he will be sorely missed.


Mike Cullen, you are a champion of the rank and file, you are a true giant among men.
