Report of the President

All of us at Union headquarters wish you and yours a very HAPPY, HEALTHY, AND BLESSED NEW YEAR!

We pause a moment to remember all our Union brothers and sisters and their loved ones who have passed on in the year 2024. You have our deepest sympathies.

The Government Publishing Office (GPO) is still accepting applications for the position of Proofreader/Keyboarder until March 2, 2025. Relocation and/or relocation incentives may be offered. If you know of anyone who may be interested in joining the GPO, tell them to visit the USAJOBS.gov Web site for more information.

CTU 101-12 membership dues cards for the year 2025 will be mailed out along with the January *Bulletin*. Members working at the GPO will receive their 2025 membership dues card from their respective shop steward. Anyone not receiving their 2025 membership dues card should contact the Local.

If you are planning to retire, a member must select between maintaining a full CWA membership or a Local/Sector membership. Retirees are not permit-



ted to change their membership status after their initial selection. Depending on what type of membership you selected at retirement, your Union dues are: \$12 for Local/Sector membership or \$24 for Full CWA membership.

The GPO Proofreader/Keyboarder apprenticeship program will graduate four or five apprentices to the position of Journeyperson in January 2025. In addition, the GPO currently has 10 or 11 individuals in the Proofreader/Keyboarder apprenticeship program who are due to graduate in January 2026.

The Fiscal Year 2023-2024 report is printed on page 2 of the January *Bulletin*. The Local has made good progress in reducing our yearly expenses and will continue to investigate how we can further reduce our expenses going forward.
